Limit 6 bags or boxes per vehicle. You must be able to unload your vehicle. For everyone's safety social distancing will be practiced.

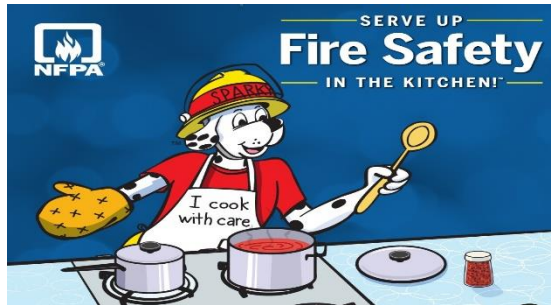
Masks required. Masks provided if needed. Please bring along a non-perishable food donation or a monetary donation to benefit Cleveland food bank.
