The Solid Waste District will accept any television for recycling at 4750 East 131 Street in Garfield Heights from 9:00-11:00 AM. A fee of \$20 per unit will be charged, payable by cash or check only. Registration is required. This is a drive-through trunk service; the television will be unloaded from your vehicle for you. Attendees should always stay in their vehicle. Face coverings required. Tube televisions and flat-screen TVs contain harmful, toxic chemicals and parts. If they are not safely disposed of, they can leak chemicals into the ground and air, harming our drinking water and air quality. Many components inside a TV are recyclable.
