Welcome to our e-newsletter publication. **With all the Coronavirus misinformation being reported, we ask our residents to keep up to date with the latest information through the [Cuyahoga County Board of Health's page](#).** The Ohio Department of Health (ODH) has opened a coronavirus (COVID-19) public hotline, reachable seven days a week from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. at 1-833-4-ASK-ODH (1-833-427-5634).

On April 2, 2020, the Mayor signed an [Executive Order Declaring a State of Emergency](#) for the City of Richmond Heights on April 2, 2020.

Ohio Primary Election Information was released this week letting us know that in the state of Ohio there will be no in-person voting at polling locations. Voting by mail only. You must request a ballot from the Board of Elections by noon on April 25, 2020. Ballot must be received by the [Cuyahoga County Board of Elections](#) by 7:30 p.m. April 27, 2020 in-person OR postmarked by April 26, 2020.

The deadline for filing [R.I.T.A. municipal income tax returns](#) has been extended from April 15, 2020 to July 15, 2020. The deadlines for the tax year 2020 1st and 2nd Quarter estimates have been extended to July 15, 2020.

The Police Department is implementing a system that enables residents to file non-emergency crime reports online. Find instructions on the [Police Department website](#) under [Citizen Reporting](#) or City of Richmond Heights Police Department [Facebook page](#).

2020 CENSUS-RESPOND YOUR WAY

The 2020 Census is happening now. Help shape your future, and your community's future, by responding to the 2020 Census. Homes began receiving their invitation to respond to the 2020 Census between March 12-20. These official Census Bureau mailings include detailed information and a Census ID for completing the Census online. **You can [complete your questionnaire online](#), by phone, or by mail. Every person counted matters!**

Everyone has a tremendous effect on funding for vital programs and vital programs and services used by residents Cuyahoga County. For every person not counted in Ohio, \$1,814 is lost in funds that would go toward these programs and resources.

City and County Planners also use census data to plan for hospitals, nursing homes, and other clinics. Cuyahoga County and State of Ohio agencies rely on census data to build new roads and repair our infrastructure. Cleveland Metropolitan School District and other regional Public School districts even use census information to draw school district boundaries.
