Welcome to the City of Richmond Heights Information Line. This recording is updated monthly or on an as needed basis, and this is the August 1st, 2020 recording.

The City continues to operate with full services while the buildings remain closed to the public until further notice. Only building vestibules remain open allowing the public where they can call the number posted, make deliveries, safely exchange documents & items.

Staff remains committed to serving residents and businesses and maintaining essential city operations. City meetings continue via Zoom and all meeting schedules and Zoom meeting ID numbers can be obtained on the City Website, the weekly E-Newsletter and posted on the outside doors of City Hall.

The Shred Day originally scheduled for May 28th has been rescheduled for August 8th, 2020 from 9-noon. You must be able to lift the items you bring out of your car, as city workers will not be allowed to assist due to the increased risk of exposure to the corona virus. There will be a limit of 6 bags or boxes per car.
