AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 79-2013 TO REVISE THE COMPENSATION OF THE ASSISTANT TO THE RECREATION DIRECTOR OF THE CITY OF RICHMOND HEIGHTS FOR THE PERIOD JANUARY 1, 2014 THROUGH CALENDAR YEAR 2015; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Council desires to correct the compensation of the Assistant to the Recreation Director for the City for the period of January 1, 2014 through calendar year 2015 to what was intended to be in Section 10 of Ordinance No. 79-2013, adopted by this Council on April 22, 2014 for that position;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Ordained by the Council of the City of Richmond Heights, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1: Existing Section 10 of Ordinance No. 79-2013, the Pay Ordinance of the City, is amended only to the extent of revising the compensation for the Assistant to Recreation Director as follows:

RECREATION DEPARTMENT.

Compensation for the members of the Recreation Department shall be as follows:

APSE HNE x 1 – Assistant to Recreation	\$9,245 – \$18,766 per year (2014)
Director (part-time position)	\$15.00 - \$23.00 per hour (2014)
	\$9,245 – \$22,000 per year (2015)
	\$15.00 - \$23.00 per hour (2015)

Section 2. Pursuant to the Council's appropriation therefor, Council authorizes the hourly rate of pay for 2014 for the Assistant to Recreation Director at \$22.26 from January 1, 2014 through the effective date of this Ordinance, at which time the hourly rate of pay will be \$16.00 per hour for the remainder of 2014.

Section 3. Section 10 of Ordinance No. 79-2013, is repealed to the extent it is modified by this Ordinance.

Section 4. This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the City in that it is required to establish more definitive rate of pay for a part-time employee and classification and further for the purpose of continued operation of the municipal government and the continuation of necessary City services. Wherefore, this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force effective immediately, after its passage by Council and signature of the Mayor.
