A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A PURCHASE
AGREEMENT FOR FIRE HOSE, ADAPTORS, AND RELATED EQUIPMENT
FOR THE DIVISION OF FIRE

WHEREAS, the Division of Fire must replace fire hose, adaptors, and related equipment to serve the citizen of the City of Richmond Heights; and

WHEREAS, the City has received a U.S. Department of Homeland Security "Assistance to Firefighters Grant" in the amount of \$25,000 for this purchase and which grant requires a five percent (5%) matching funds amount by the City.

WHEREAS, the required equipment is available from Finley Fire Equipment, Russell, Ohio. The City will be required to pay the entire amount for the items, and will be reimbursed in the amount of \$23,750.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Richmond Heights, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1: The Mayor is authorized to enter into an agreement with Finley Fire Equipment for the purchase of fire hose, adaptors and related equipment for the Division of Fire at a cost not to exceed \$25,000.

Section 2: The Director of Finance is hereby directed to appropriate from the Ambulance Billing Fund (233), in the amount of \$25,000 to pay the expenses under the Agreement, and the grant funds are to be returned to the Ambulance Billing Fund, except for the required five percent (5%) match to accept the within Grant.

Section 3: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4: This Resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
