

RESOLUTION NO.: 121 -2014

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT FOR THE PURCHASE OF THE NECESSARY EMERGENCY RESPONSE EQUIPMENT PACKAGE, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Whereas, Council has previously authorized the purchase of a new chase utility truck for the Division of Fire, which is now in need of the emergency response equipment package (lights, radios, sirens, and markings) to be obtained from an appropriate vendor(s) and a cost not to exceed Nine Thousand Dollars (\$9,000.00).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Richmond Heights, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1: The Mayor is authorized to enter into an agreement with an appropriate vendor(s) for the purchase the necessary emergency response equipment package for the new chase utility truck for the Division of Fire, in an amount not to exceed Nine Thousand Dollars (\$9,000.00).

Section 2: The Finance Director is authorized and directed to appropriate to a proper account a sum sufficient to cover the cost of said purchase agreement and additional equipment costs referred to in Sections 1 above.

Section 3: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4: This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and general welfare of the City, and for the further reason that the new vehicle needs the additional equipment as soon as possible so that it can be place in service for the benefit of the citizens of the City of Richmond Heights; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage, provided it receives the affirmative vote of five members of Council; otherwise, it shall be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
