A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A CONTRACT WITH OHIO PAVING & CONSTRUCTION CO., INC. FOR THE PATH RENOVATION PROJECT.

WHEREAS, bids were received by the City for the construction of the Path Renovation Project (the "Project") for the restoration of the walking trails at Richmond Heights Community Park and on the east side of Richmond Road along the Cuyahoga County Airport with such work to be performed in accordance with the specifications prepared therefor by the City Engineer and on file with the City;

WHEREAS, the lowest and best bid received for the Project was the bid of Ohio Paving & Construction Co., Inc. in the amount of \$116,333.50;

WHEREAS, the paving work which is the subject of this contract must be completed this fall before inclement weather prevents it from being timely completed;

WHEREAS, the City has been awarded a federal Community Development Block Grant ("CDBG") through the Cuyahoga County Municipal Grant Program for this Project in the amount of \$150,000 from Cuyahoga County with a match of \$10,000 in City funds;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Richmond Heights, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1: A contract with Ohio Paving & Construction Co., Inc. is authorized for the Path Renovation Project in an amount not to exceed \$116,333.50.

Section 2: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 3: This Ordinance Resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
