

RESOLUTION NO.: 53 -2022

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE DONATION OF FITNESS EQUIPMENT THAT IS OBSOLETE AND NOT NEEDED FOR CITY PURPOSES TO THE RICHMOND HEIGHTS HIGH SCHOOL.

WHEREAS, the Division of Fire has been awarded a \$39,104.00 grant by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency Assistance to Firefighters Grants program, which will be utilized for a fitness and injury prevention program in the Division of Fire;

WHEREAS, part of the grant funds will be used to replace four (4) pieces of fitness equipment consisting of a Smith machine, a cable crossover, a leg press and a stair climber; which were purchased and/or donated to the City more than fifteen years ago;

WHEREAS, the Chief of Fire has recommended discarding the fitness equipment to be replaced, and which is of no value and is obsolete and unneeded for municipal purposes, by donating the fitness equipment to the Richmond Heights High School Athletic Department, which has expressed an interest in repurposing the equipment;

WHEREAS, Section 721.15 of the Ohio Revised Code provides for the discarding of such property by authorization of this City Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Richmond Heights, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1: The Director of Public Service and Properties is authorized to discard the personal property referenced in the recitals above, which is obsolete and unneeded for municipal purposes, by donating said property to the Richmond Heights High School Athletic Department.



