Public Hearing to be Held Tuesday, November 21

Take notice that there will be a Public Hearing of the City of Richmond Heights Department of Economic Development during the City Council meeting on Tuesday, November 21, at 8:15 p.m. in Council Chambers at Richmond Heights City Hall, 26789 Highland Road, Richmond Heights, Ohio. The purpose of the public meeting is to provide the public with the opportunity to comment on the City's request for \$50,000 of funding from Cuyahoga County through the 2018 Cuyahoga County Supplemental Grant Program. If awarded, the City will use these funds to eliminate the current septic

system at Greenwood Farm and tie the Farm into the public sanitary system. This upgrade will prevent pollution from entering Euclid Creek and make the Farm more usable for large scale City events.
