**SNOWPLOW OPERATORS MUST  
REGISTER WITH THE CITY**

The City of Richmond Heights requires all Commercial Snowplow businesses to obtain a permit. If you plow snow by means of a snow removal vehicle in the city, you need a permit from the Police Department (Ordinance 783.01). When removing snow, you cannot deposit it "on the

pavement or sidewalk of any public street or on any tree lawn in any public street, except upon the tree lawn or property of the premises from which the snow was removed." (Ordinance 738.03). Residents: If you have a snowplow service, we recommend you advise them of these ordinances. If you do not have a snowplow service and need one, you can contact the Police Department for a list of operators who have a permit.
