Although not the first organized church in Richmond Heights, theirs is the first church building at 4970 Monticello Blvd. This was built in 1957 relocating from their Addison Road Gospel Hall which had been in existence over 60 years.

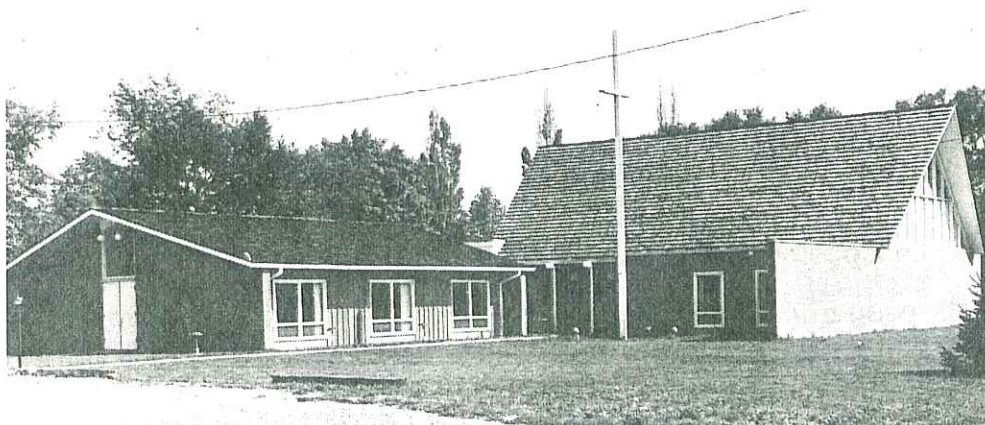


Monticello Gospel Hall—4970 Monticello Blvd.

Suburban Christian Church

The beginning of this church dates back to 1883 when they were known as Cedar Ave. Christian Church. In 1907 a new church building was built at 1607 Crawford Road and the name was changed to Crawford Road Christian Church. This served as their meeting place for 53 years. As members relocated in widely separated communities, the eventual decision to relocate was reached and the present site was purchased.

Now, as Suburban Christian Church, the congregation met in the Richmond Heights School from May, 1960 to September, 1962. The

first service in the new building was held on Sept. 9, 1962, although formal dedication services were not held until May 26, 1963. Ground was broken for the Chapel in June 1965 and a Sunrise Service held on April 10, 1966. The first section built became the fellowship hall and educational wing. First minister was John W. Neth succeeded by Robert E. Barnes, Pulpit Minister since Feb. 1963.

Church of the Nazarene

The Richmond Heights Church of the Nazarene is the result of the merger of South Euclid and Central Church of the Nazarene in 1962. A 5-acre plot of land was purchased and the first phase of their building completed in 1964. This was an educational unit with a sanctuary, kitchen and dining room for fellowship dinners, etc. The second phase of their building, a larger sanctuary, was completed and dedicated in April of 1967. It provided additional Sunday school rooms, office space and daytime nursery school. Phase 3 will be a new larger sanctuary. Pastor is the Rev. Daniel C. Hoffman.

St. Paschal Church, school and seminary at 5384 Wilson Mills Road are just over the eastern boundary in Highland Heights. This parish serves the southern part of Richmond Heights, Highland Heights and Mayfield village.

Armenian Apostolic Church

This property at 666 Richmond Road was rezoned in June 1957 but the building was not built until 1963. Services were held in the house just South of the church until the new building was completed. This is known as the Armenian Apostolic Church of Cleveland and is under the jurisdiction of the Diocese of the Armenian Church of North America.

Euclid Congregation of Jehovah's Witnesses

This Congregation was originally associated with a larger group in Cleveland Heights, but expansion in numbers enabled them to form a "new" congregation.

Their building at 26450 Chardon Road was completed in July, 1958. Most of the work was done by members of the congregation.

They have about 100 people associated with the congregation which is the desired level to give personal help in their teaching program. About 50 of the original group are still in the congregation.

The presiding minister is Fred Hossel.

St. Felicitas Roman Catholic Church

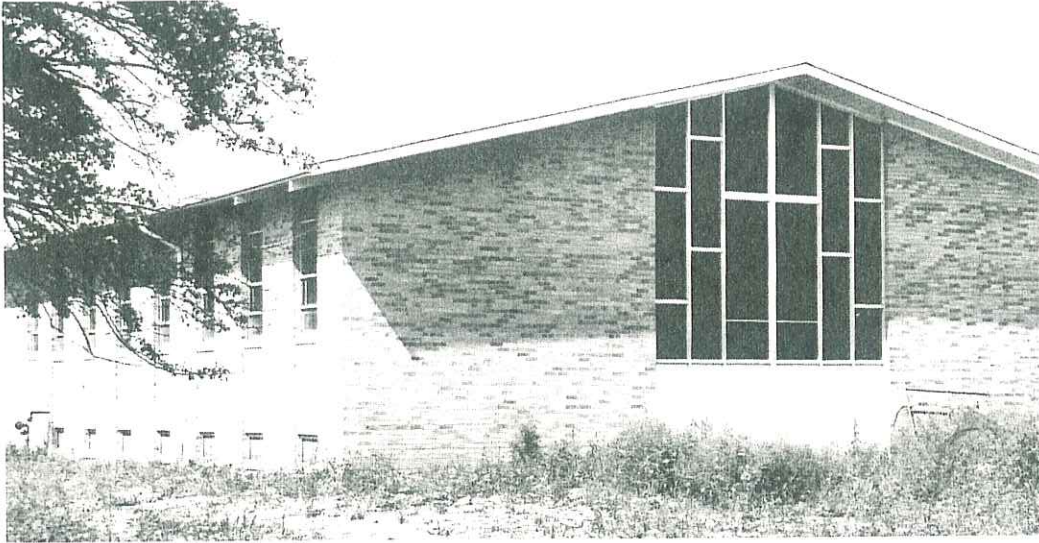

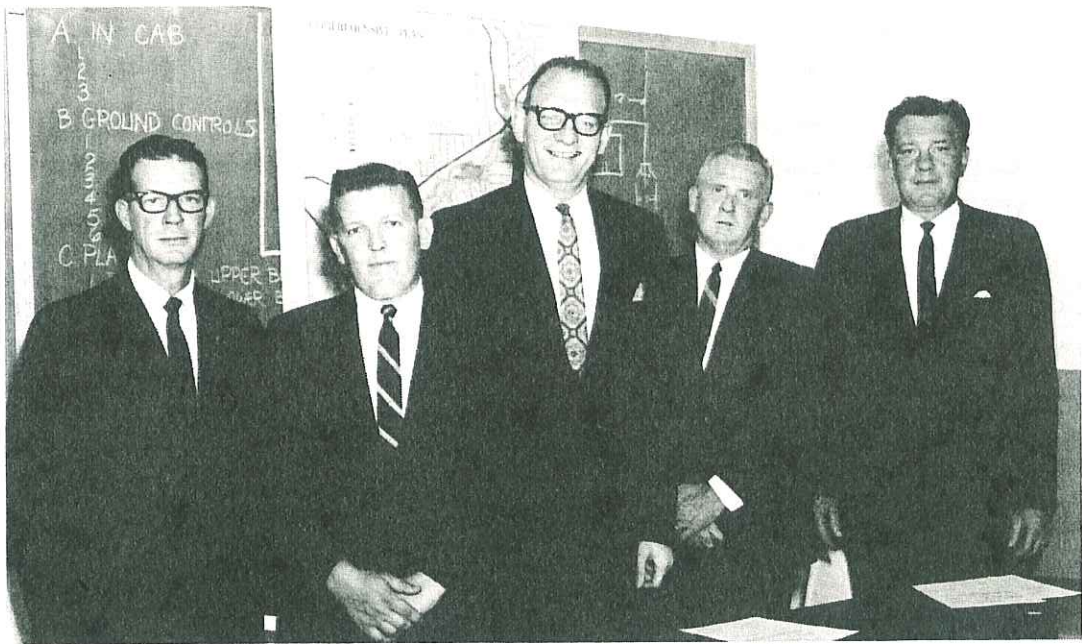

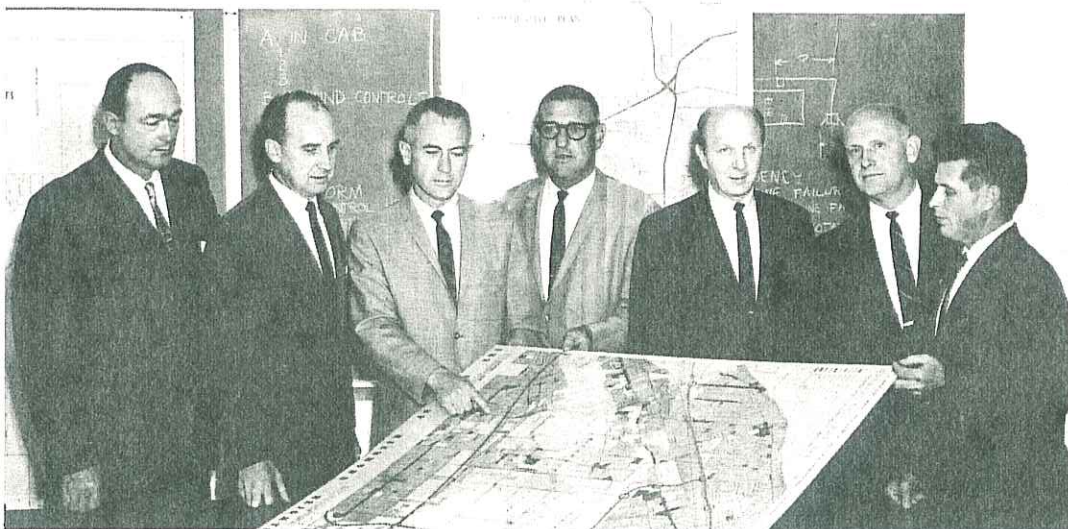

The Chairman is chosen by the Board but must be one of the three at large members.

The Board determines what the City can provide in the way of wholesome recreation for all residents of Richmond Heights. They also purchase equipment and provide maintenance and supervision for all recreational areas.

Auxiliary Police Unit

The Richmond Heights Auxiliary Police is an outgrowth of the Civilian Defense Unit with Robert Noyes as Director.

The Auxiliary Police work under the direction of the Chief of Police and members are appointed following application and approval by the Safety Director and Police Chief.

The Auxiliary Police are called upon and assigned to duties by the Police Chief and have devoted many hours to the City in traffic control, as jail attendants, assisting in emergencies and at civic functions as required.

Richmond Heights Little Theatre, Inc.

Through the diligent efforts and countless hours of planning by Mr. Charles Travis, the Richmond Heights Little Theatre was newly organized in the early spring of 1967. The first production "Brigadoon" was presented in early April and it was very well received by the crowds that attended.

Auditions are held about four months prior to each show and a variety of talents are needed. This includes both singers and non-singers, dancers, and those wishing to work behind scenes on the production staff of a show.

Two shows a year are presented, one in the spring and one in the fall. The next production will be "Oklahoma" on October 27, 28, 29.

In view of the honest effort on the part of the executive staff to bring good theatre entertainment to Richmond Heights Theatre audiences, and the combined efforts of the members and participants in its shows, it is hoped that community interest will continue to be aroused to support it.

A main objective of the organization is to stimulate interest and to keep the membership informed on matters of social and political issues. Topical programs are presented on a regular basis at the monthly meetings which feature interesting and qualified guest speakers.

In its effort to promote good fellowship and attract new members, the club sponsors several social activities during the year. These affairs, which include clam bakes, dinner-dances, and Christmas parties, have become traditional with many citizens of our City.

Equally important among the club's objectives is its responsibility to the community. The Richmond Heights Democratic Club has furnished the School System with American Flags for the classrooms and has installed the flag pole and supplied flags for the new City Hall. The club also makes annual donations to the Little League, Amateur Sports, Richmond Heights Scholarship Fund, and the Booster Club as well as participating in Richmond Heights Home Days. . .and we are also seen around on election days.

The regular business meetings are held the last Thursday of every month at the Union Savings and Loan, Wilson Mills at Richmond Rd. New Members are always welcome!

Friendship Club

September 1945 saw the start of this Club by a small group of residents who felt a need for a group to discuss civic needs, school needs, and for just plain social fun. The name "Friendship" was suggested by Mrs. Albert Verbsky (Bertha). The Club took charge of the school picnic, Christmas parties, etc. until the PTA was formed in 1950. They continued helping the school as well as sponsoring the first Teen Canteen, donating money to the Boy Scouts, Little League and helping to buy fire equipment for the Volunteer Fire Department. They sponsored a family picnic each summer until the fire department resumed having their Home Days.

In May 1957 they sponsored an adult polio program which gave all residents a chance to get the necessary three Salk vaccine shots recommended for the prevention of polio.

Because they hated to see the old brick building torn down on the corner of Highland and Richmond (which had been first a school, then a residence, and finally the Village Hall), they arranged to have Mary Miles, a 1965 graduate of the high school, paint it for all to remember. It was presented to the Council in October 1965 and now hangs in the main corridor of the new City Hall.

The Club still meets on the fourth Wednesday at the Union Savings Bank and welcomes all newcomers to their meetings.

Boy Scout Troop No. 431

Troop 431 was chartered in April 1955 with 21 boys enrolled. Don Horning was the first Scoutmaster with Jack Hoyt as his assistant.

Harold Bunsey served as Explorer Advisor. The Troop Committee, mostly fathers of the scouts, were extremely active and within a year, the troop had full equipment for summer camp. Of this original troop committee, Tony Garzone, Art Gezann and Ernie Gottschling continue as registered members.

Following Don Horning as Scoutmaster, was Jack Hoyt in 1956, Jim Johnson for the next two years, then Carl Keidel from 1958 to 1962. Since then Ernie Gottschling has lead the troop.

Eagles, the highest award in Scouting, have been awarded to Gary Gezann, Tom Wilson, Larry Johnson, Fred Gottschling, Rick Prijatel, Gary Stavanja, Larry Campana, Steve Liszkay and Carl Gottschling. They meet every Thursday from 7 to 8:30 at Faith United Church on Richmond Road.

An Explorer's Post was organized about 1960 and was disbanded because of lack of boys. An Explorer's Air Post #505 started up last year, meeting at the airport under the sponsorship of the Kiwanis Club.

Kiwanis Club of Richmond Heights

In 1960 a number of residents in the growing Community of Richmond Heights, feeling the need for a service organization, attempted to organize a Richmond Heights Kiwanis Club but efforts at that time failed. After continued efforts over the next two years with the help of neighboring Kiwanis Clubs in South Euclid, Lyndhurst and Euclid a successful organizational meeting was achieved in November of 1962 and finally on December 13, 1962 a charter was presented to the Kiwanis Club of Richmond Heights.

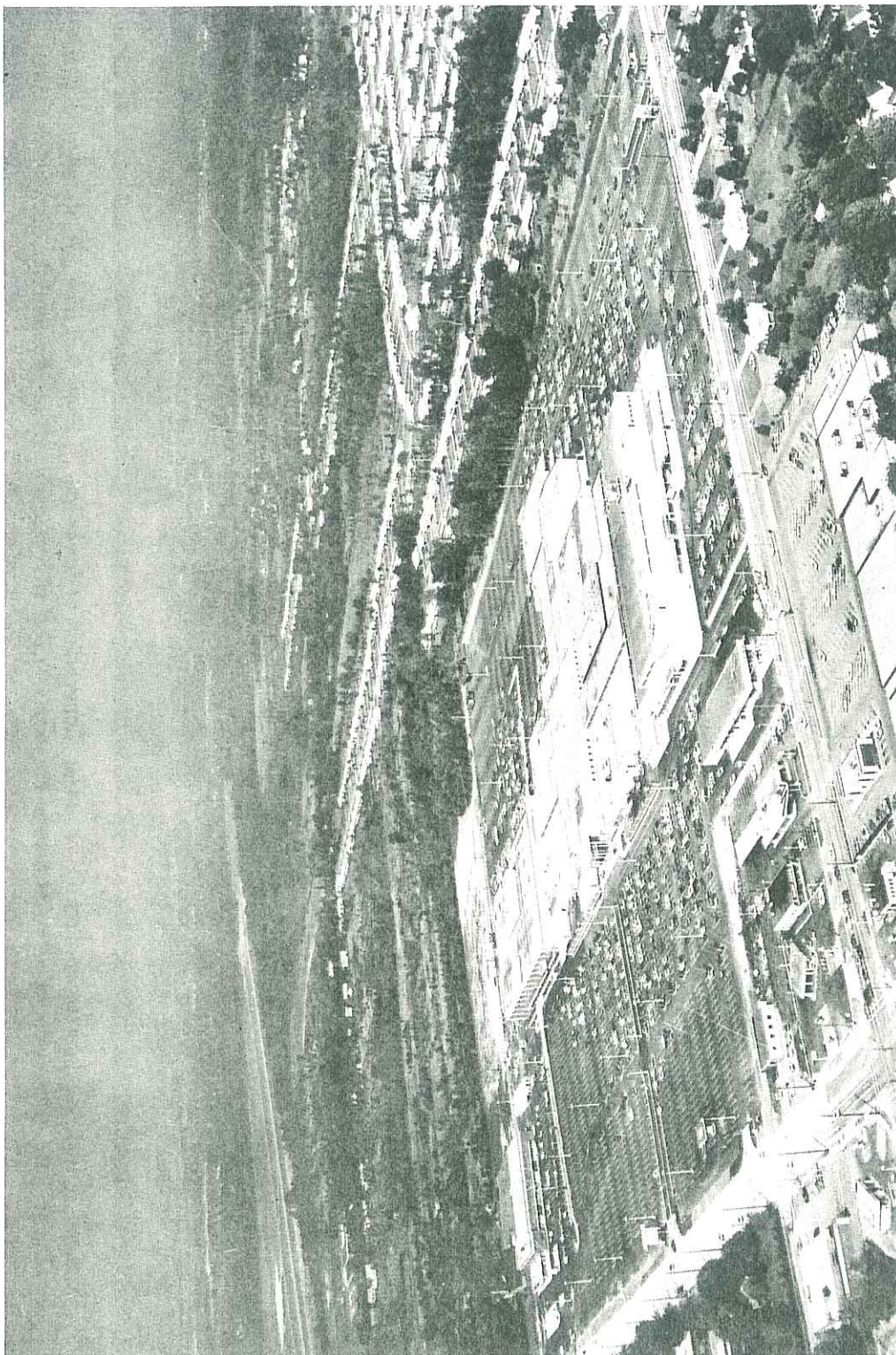

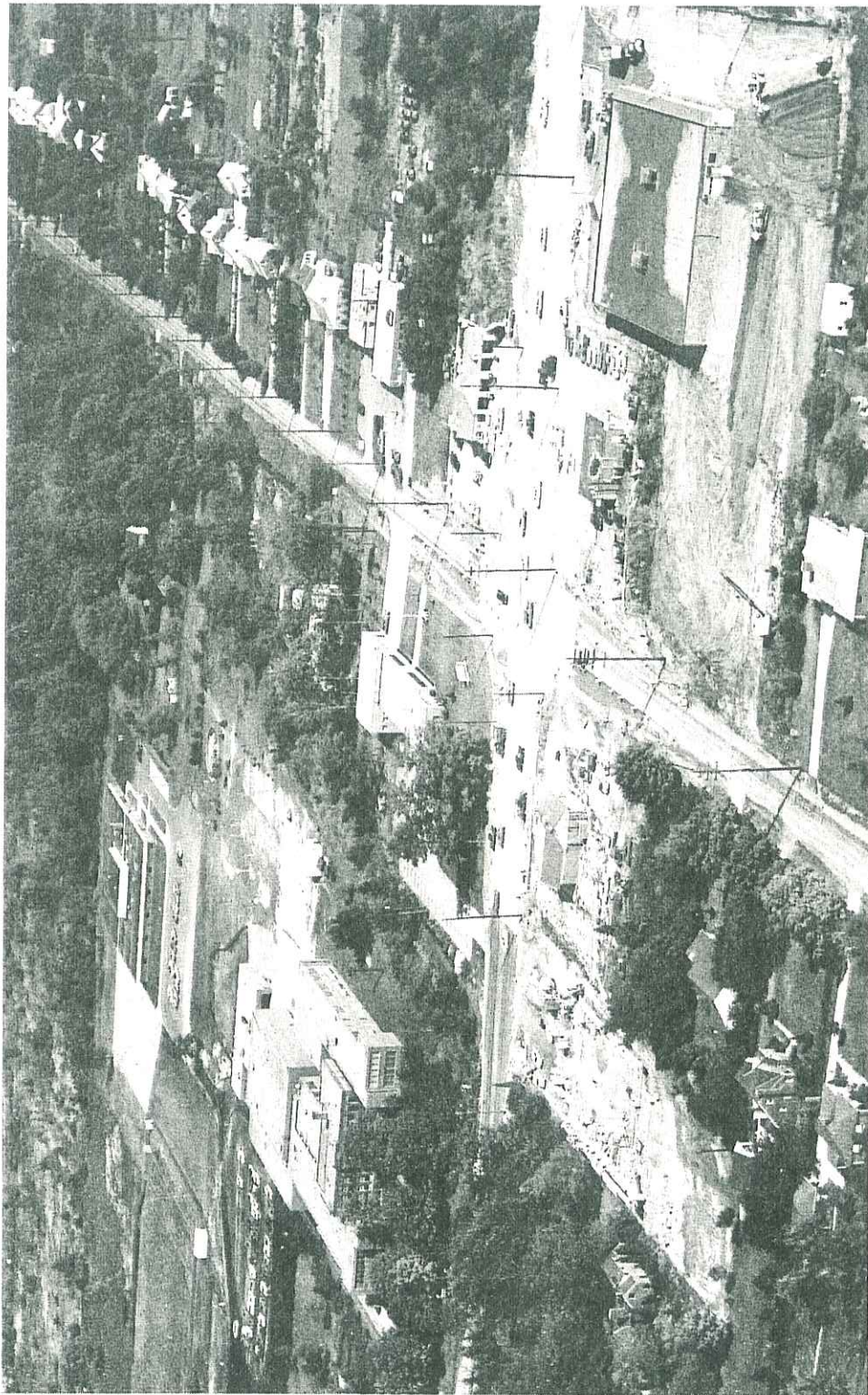

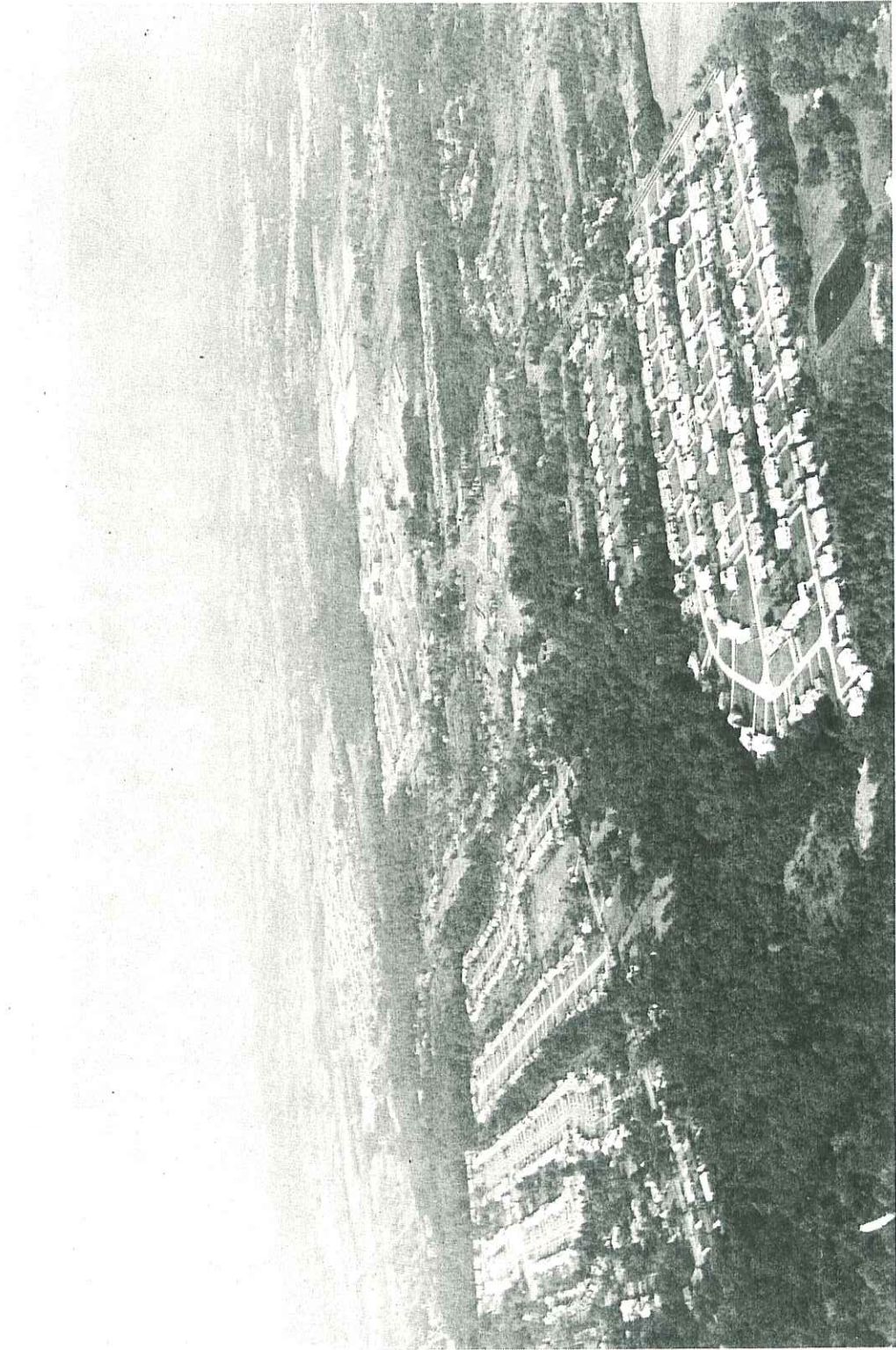

Historic Notes

The Champney estate covered 254 acres in the area which is now Scottish Highlands. They had no permanent home here, but they had two summer homes in the rear by the ponds. The house at 25625 Highland, now occupied by the Burton Todd family, was occupied by the Jos. Hanslik family when he worked for Champney's. This house was a log cabin but has since been covered with siding.

The house at 25217 Highland, occupied by Tom Koch, was the office for the saw mill and grist mill. This could be operated only after a heavy rain when there was enough water flow to turn the water wheel.

The relocation of Highland Rd. will follow the route of the old Harms Rd. hill.

Many of the older brick houses in the area were built of bricks made on the job.

There was a cemetery just north of the new post office which contained many of the Richmond ancestors.

Another cemetery was on the Mosbacher property. They purchased the land about 1917 and had a garden. Neighbors told them their garden was where an old cemetery used to be, although they never found any gravestones.

November 7, 1921—Council passed Resolution #33 to participate in creation of a Metropolitan Planning Commission.

In 1928 The Metropolitan Park board acquired 6 acres of land in the south west corner of Richmond Heights near Hilltop Rd.

In 1933 the Mayor, Clerk and Treasurer took a voluntary 50% cut in salary.

In the early 1940's Euclid Central High School had valedictorians from Richmond Heights for three years in a row and Glenn Stevenson was Salutatorian the fourth year. The three were Frank Trebisky, Valeria Toth and Betty Keyerleber.

President's Message

Preparing a Fifty Year Historical Booklet on the City of Richmond Heights was a venture that required a tremendous amount of time, energy, and money.

She was defeated each time. Helen Keidel served as a member and Secretary of the Recreation Board in 1965 and 1966. She is a charter member of Faith United Church of Christ, a member of the Richmond Heights Little Theater Group and is Republican Precinct Committeeman for Ward 4-C.

Chairman Fred Keyerleber did an outstanding job in organizing and gathering pictures and data from the "old timers" who live or have lived in Richmond Heights, Ohio, as well as searching through the City Records.

As President of the Richmond Heights Kiwanis Club and on behalf of all Kiwanis Members, I thank all of the residents, former residents, friends, neighbors and all business men in and around the City of Richmond Heights for their generosity and interest in participating in the preparation of this Fiftieth Year Historical Booklet on the City of Richmond Heights.
